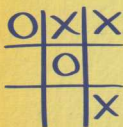

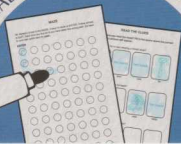

## It is **IMPORTANT** to use the pen properly.

1. Pen should be used with very light pressure. Excessive pressure may damage the pen point, printing and paper.
2. Always replace the cap when not in use.

Pen may dry out, or not react properly, if the cap is left off too long. If this happens, immerse tip in clean water for a **MAXIMUM** of **ONE MINUTE**. Sometimes excessive or constant rubbing pressure may cause the end of the tip to glaze over, restricting the flow of ink. This can be corrected by punching a series of holes in the end of the tip with a pin (this should only be performed by an adult).
